President's Message

It's winter time so things are getting a bit easier. I know we're always busy but maybe you'll find a bit of time to think about your breeding program. Breeding is easy, you take a female and a male and you see what you'll get. Today we have a lot of information available to us including Production records, Classifications, Index, Bull Proofs, Mating programs, Triple aAa and more. That information is paid for by us, so we may as well make use of it. At the end of the day it's still the breeder that makes the decisions and has to live with them, whether they are great or just so so. I believe a good mating program brings better offspring. We have the opportunity to use bulls from around the globe. But it is still a challenge for small breeders to get their hands on that semen. My recommendation is to buy a tank for your farm so you can store your own semen so it is available whenever you need it. Do a mating program either by yourself or with help from a professional to find the right bulls. Find the place where you can order them in advance, so that you have that particular semen available when the cow is in heat. If you chose to do your own breeding you can, if you don't your local Al technician will be happy to help you. I know you are aware of these things but a friendly reminder always encourages people. Think about it this way, the decisions you make today affect your milking herd three or four years down the road. The extra 10-30 dollars you spend on a good bull will be paid off fast with a good heifer. Our Brown Swiss breed has significantly improved in production and conformation. So therefore you breeders are doing a really good job. Congratulations.

Coming to the annual meeting in Stratford, March 29th, 30th and 31st, is in my opinion another breeding tool. You'll get to meet a lot of fellow breeders and you can exchange tips and tricks of the trade. For me the most enjoyable part of these meetings are the farm tours. You get to visit with the farmers and see how they do things, and see the success of their breeding programs. See you in Stratford.

Interpreting Bull Proofs for Intermediate Optimum Traits

The Canadian type classification system includes 22 descriptive traits that are analyzed on a 9-point scale. While most of these traits are appraised in a manner whereby scores near the high end of the scale (i.e.: 7-9) are most desired, there are six traits that have an intermediate optimum. How does the genetic evaluation system handle these mid-scoring traits and how should bull proofs be used for making solid sire selection decisions?

The Underlying Data

A key objective of a high quality type classification program is to evaluate and record the cow's phenotype for each descriptive trait using the 9-point linear scale. Note that the focus at this stage of the classification process is obtaining an accurate description of the cow rather than stating whether her appraisal for the specific trait is most desirable. Once all descriptive traits associated with each of the four major scorecard sections (i.e.: Rump, Mammary System, Feet & Legs, Dairy Strength) are appraised, they are combined into a scorecard rating for that section based on specific definitions of desirability for each linear trait. Six traits, namely Rump Angle, Rear Legs Side View, Udder Depth, Fore Teat Placement, Rear Teat Placement and Teat Length, have an intermediate optimum since the score of 5 (or 6 in the case of Fore Teat Placement) is considered ideal.

Calculating Bull Proofs

Genetic evaluations aim to describe the average daughter performance expected in the future based on any known information about existing daughters or other family members. For traits that are recorded on a continuous scale, such as milk yield, a bull's daughters will obviously vary over a range across that scale but the average expected performance in the future is accurately described by the sire's published proof whereby the higher the value the better it is. For the six mid-scoring type traits, however, the scale is closed, ranging only between 1 and 9, so the published proofs reflect the average tendency of bull's daughters from one extreme to another. For this reason, the proofs for these six descriptive traits are published as a numerical value (without a "+" or '-" sign) and a specific letter code. The letter code indicates the direction of the bull's tendency for that trait in his daughters while the numerical value indicates the magnitude of that tendency. As for all other type traits, a numerical rating of 5 or higher reflects a significant tendency where the most extreme bulls for either tendency are rated near 15 with the appropriate letter code. It is important to note that the expression of proofs in this manner makes no statement about which rating is most desirable. The focus is on describing the average daughter of each bull so that the proofs can be used in selection decisions to make improvements in any direction, as the need arises.

Pin Setting and Set of Rear Legs

Since February 1997, Canada has used the classification data for two of these intermediate optimum traits, namely Rump Angle and Rear Legs Side View, to produce additional bull proofs labelled Pin Setting and Set of Rear Legs, respectively. While this dual proof system using the same field data may complicate the interpretation of each, it provides a more accurate representation of what to expect in the bull's future daughters.

The need for this approach arises from the fact that there are several bulls that have an average daughter score near the ideal of 5 but the distribution of daughters shows relatively few desirable daughters and a similar proportion of daughters at each extreme. For this reason the proofs for Rump Angle and Rear Legs Side View include an unsigned numerical rating plus a letter code, which is referred to as the *tendency* scale. Since proofs for Pin Setting and Set of Rear Legs reflect the likelihood of producing a daughter that has the ideal rating of 5, they are expressed on a *desirability* scale ranging from about –15 to +15 similar to most other type traits (see table).

Proof Interpretation and Sire Selection

Perhaps the most common misunderstanding that exists with bull proofs for these two special mid-scoring traits is that they are often used with the concept of corrective mating. For example, it is frequently thought that a cow with high pins should be mated to a sire that has a Rump Angle proof showing a strong tendency towards low pins, with the hope that the resulting progeny will land somewhere in between with ideal pins. In fact, the best way to improve a weakness for either Rump Angle (high or low pins) or Rear Legs Side View (straight or curved legs) is to use sires that have a rating of at least +10 on the desirability scale. This means that sire selection decisions for these traits should first be based of proofs for Pin Setting and Set of Rear Legs and when these ratings are below +10 consideration should then be given to the proofs for Rump Angle and Rear Leg Side View to identify the tendency of the bull's weakness for each trait. In any event, animals showing a common fault at either extreme for these mid-scoring traits should not be mated together if improvement is desired.

Summary

Genetic evaluations for descriptive type traits with intermediate optimum describe the average daughter performance expected in the future without making a statement about which extreme is most desired. Classification data for Rump Angle and Rear Legs Side View are analyzed twice to provide the complete picture of each sire's future daughter performance. Proofs for Pin Setting and Set of Rear Legs reflect the likelihood of producing an ideal daughter for these traits with the highest rating being most desired and they should be the primary tools for making sire selection decisions. For sires that have a lower frequency of desirable daughters for these traits, proofs for Rump Angle and Rear Legs Side View provide additional information showing the tendency of their weakness by the letter code and its magnitude by the numerical rating. These traits have moderately high heritabilities and genetic improvement can be achieved.


